- 863 new membership agreements received since JCP 2.10 was introduced in May 2016.
- 663 Associate Membership Agreements (52 were converted from individual full memberships).
- 43 Partner Membership Agreements (5 were converted from JUG full memberships).
- 62 Employer Contribution Agreements.
- 60 individual JSPAs.
- 39 corporate JSPAs.
- 2 non-profit JSPAs.
