### **PMO Report**

The PMO presented the usual stats and community updates to the EC Members. Because it has been less than 4 weeks since the last EC Meeting, and that was holiday time for most, this agenda was very short.

### **JCP.next**

The PMO presented four initiatives that it wanted to kick-off following the guidance of the Toronto meeting.

1- A JSR to make the JSPA more modular, easier to update, cleaner, and also digitally submissible. This JSR would not make any changes to the terms of the JSPA, just the structure.

2- An investigation of how to solve some of the process issues that were raised in Toronto. The PMO feels these changes will require at most a maintenance release of JSR 215, but it still needs to do more investigation.

3- An ad hoc group to investigate the problem of JCP Members submitting JSRs too early, in an attempt to grab land (it was termed the "gold rush" problem in the meeting. Motorola agreed to chair this ad hoc group and the PMO agreed to facilitate it.

4- An ad hoc group to investigate Open Source issues. This was already discussed and approved in Toronto.

All of the these initiatives were agreed to, with objection from any EC Members.

### **Purple JSRs**

No progress had been made on the Purple JSRs proposal from the PMO. The PMO agreed to give it more of a priority and come back to the ECs before the meeting in October.
