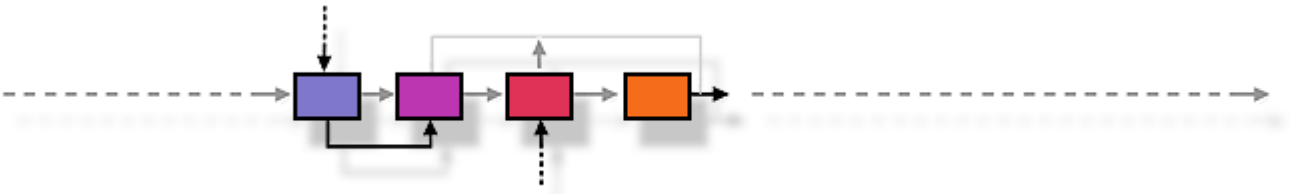

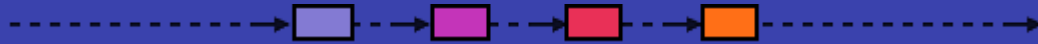

# Personnel changes



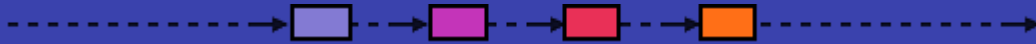
- SE
  - Erkki Rysa replaced Pentti Savolainen as Nokia's primary representative.
  - Nortel has resigned their EC seat.
- ME
  - Thibaud Mienville replaced Philippe Lucas as Orange's primary representative.
  - Philips has resigned their EC seat.

# 2009 Election schedule & logistics



- Ballot runs 20 October – 2 November at [eballot.votenet.com/jcp](http://eballot.votenet.com/jcp).
- Ballots for ratified and elected seats take place simultaneously as defined in version 2.7 of the Process Document.
- EC members should vote early, to help identify any issues with the new system.
- Audit results will be published to ECs.
- Change in membership effective 17 November 2009.
  - First meeting of new ECs: 8 December teleconference.

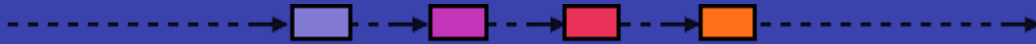
# 2009 Election: available seats



- SE/EE EC
  - Ratified seats: Fujitsu, HP, IBM, Oracle
  - Elected seat: Doug Lea
  - Resignation: Nortel (2010)
- ME EC
  - Ratified seats: Motorola, Qisda, Siemens, Vodafone
  - Elected seat: Ericsson
  - Resignations: Motorola (2009) and Philips (2011)

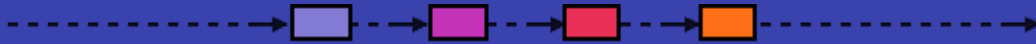


# 2009 Elections: nominations for ratified seats



- Nominations for the ratified seats on the SE/EE EC:
  - Fujitsu, HP, IBM, Doug Lea, Oracle
    - NOTE: Doug Lea is nominated in place of Nortel, and will be up for re-election in 2010.
- Nominations for the ratified seats on the ME EC:
  - AT&T, Siemens, SK Telecom, T-Mobile, Vodafone.
    - NOTE: whichever of the three new nominees (AT&T, SK Telecom, T-Mobile) gets the lowest number of votes will fill the remainder of Philips' term, and will be up for re-election in 2011 rather than 2012.

# 2009 Elections: nominations for elected seats



- Nominations for the elected seat on the SE/EE EC:
  - Liferay
  - Matthew McCullough
  - Tim Peierls
  - Terracotta
    - Doug Lea is nominated to Nortel's ratified seat.
- Nominations for the elected seat on the ME EC:
  - Jacob Feldman
    - Ericsson declined to run again.

# JCP.org 1.1 release



- Updates and new features are being rolled out on a release schedule.
  - Next release is 10 November 2009.
- Planned features:
  - RSS feeds for wiki pages and discussion boards.
  - Search for wiki pages and discussion boards.
  - User-ratings for wikis and board content.
  - Fixes to WYSIWYG editor for Wiki and boards.
  - Modifications to left navigation bar.
  - Assorted bug fixes.

# Classification of JSRs on JCP.org



- JSRs by Committee
  - ME, SE/EE.
- JSRs by Technology
  - OSS, JAIN, XML.
- JSRs by Platform
  - For SE and EE, this really means “JSRs incorporated into the Platform JSR.”
  - For ME, what does it mean?
- We have no list of JSRs by target platform.
  - ME, SE, or EE (a small number target more than one platform.)

# ME Working Group update



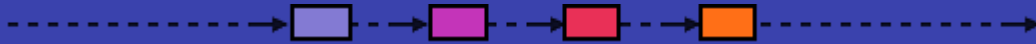
- Security
  - “Quiet diplomacy” with operators is more likely to succeed than mandating a uniform security policy.
- JATAF
  - Can be an effective remedy against fragmentation. We need to encourage broad developer participation via our marketing efforts.
- Uniform licensing mechanism
  - JSR-215 Working Group should pick this up once we all agree to take the next steps to reform.

# ME Working Group: marketing



- Public perception is that Java ME is “old technology” and that innovation is happening elsewhere.
  - While there has been some slowing of ME activity within the JCP, Java ME is still very much alive.
    - 22 Active JSRs, including 5 Final Releases within the last 18 months.
- We need to spread the word:
  - JATAF messages
  - Java ME: not just for phones
  - Java ME: not just for low end phones (MIDP3/MSA)
  - Momentum release (tell people what's happening)
  - Success stories, quotes

# ME Working Group: surveying the landscape



- Following on from a review of all Active ME JSRs the Working Group is reviewing all JSRs to classify them as:
  - COMPLETED (finished, no need for active maintenance)
  - REPLACED (newer version available or under development in a separate JSR)
  - MAINTENANCE (JSR is completed but is still actively maintained by the Maintenance Lead or the former EG)
  - IN PROGRESS (under development - not yet completed)
  - RESTART (rejected, withdrawn, or inactive: should be resurrected)
  - NOT NEEDED (rejected, withdrawn, or inactive: no need to resurrect)
- In addition, we are discussing whether new JSRs are needed to provide missing functionality.

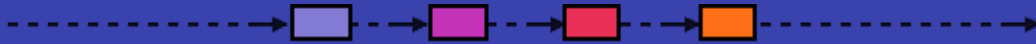

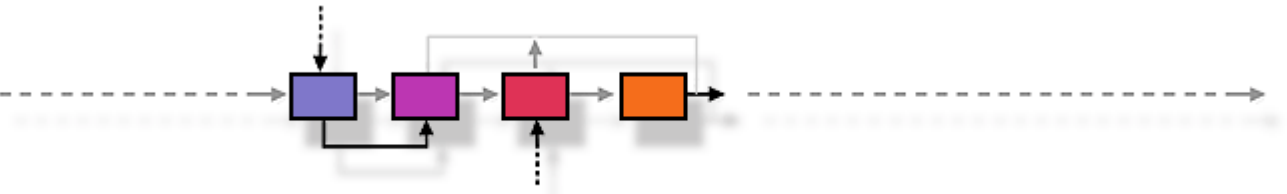
