PMO Report

The PMO presented the usual set of statistics and updates from the community. The PMO also asked EC Members for help in several events – including press events and community/user group events. The JCP also presented the final versions of the Early Access Documents and asked the ECs if they had any further guidance to the PMO before it posted those tot he jcp.org web site.

JavaOne Awards

EC Members were thanked for participating in the JavaOne awards that the JCP handed out. The EC Members also were reminded of all of the events that the JCP had planned for JavaOne – including a Communities in Action night, a JCP BOF, a press roundtable, and the JCP booth on the pavilion floor.

Purple JSRs

After talking about them for a while, the ECs settled on the name of "purple JSRs" to describe JSRs which are based on an external spec, and want to have the ability for the external spec to stay in sync with the JSR. (Thanks to Graham Hamilton for the name.) Since the previous meeting, the PMO had put together a proposal for how to solve this problem and the ECs discussed the proposal. Some EC Members stressed the importance of compatibility, while others pushed to ensure these new kinds of JSRs could be successful without too many extra restrictions. In the end, EC Members wanted more time to provide feedback and suggestions to the proposal.

JCP.next

Several EC Members provided input to the discussion of what the ECs should focus on next, now that JCP 2.6 is complete. IBM, Ericsson Mobile and Intel presented their ideas at this meeting and they were discussed. EC Members were encouraged to provide input before the EC Meeting in July, the PMO is interested in coming to some conclusion and taking the Next step in August.
